The Institute for the Conservation of Tropical Environments (ICTE) and the Centre ValBio Data Crucible are excited to announce the inaugural series of seed grants for projects that use or otherwise relate to data collected at Centre ValBio in Ranomafana National Park, Madagascar.

A total award pool of **\$75,000** will be split among qualified applicants .

A maximum of **\$15,000** in seed funding can be awarded to any individual applicant.
Joint applications by two faculty will be allowed, doubling the available money to **\$30,000**.

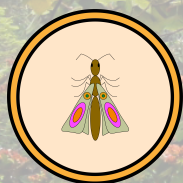
All permanent Stony Brook faculty are eligible to apply!

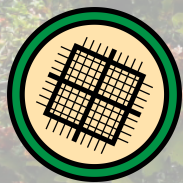
