1885-00

This report includes the results for all **FIRST-TIME FULL-TIME** freshmen who responded to the survey. HERI determines the status of each respondent by how he/she answered Question #'s 4, 5, 14 and 15 on the survey instrument (see below).

The results for respondents deemed by HERI to be other than First-time Full-time freshmen (if any) can be found in the Institutional Profile 1885-98 (Standard Breakouts). A Report showing the results for all respondents regardless of student status can also be found in 1885-98.

DETERMINING STUDENT STATUS

RULE #1

IF a respondent indicates that he/she did not graduate from high school in the current year (Question #4) **AND**, **IF** the respondent reports having taken courses for credit at his/her freshman institution (Question #14) **OR** the respondent reports having taken any courses (for credit or not for credit) at any other postsecondary institution (Question #15),
THEN the respondent is considered "not first-time", or **TRANSFER**.

RULE #2

IF a respondent fails the tests in Rule #1 (i.e., is considered a first-time respondent) **AND** indicates he/she is enrolling as a part-time student (Question #5),
THEN the respondent is considered "not full-time, or **PART-TIME**

RULE #3

IF a respondent fails the tests in Rule #1 **AND** Rule #2,
THEN the respondent is considered a "**FIRST-TIME FULL-TIME** freshman."

RULE #4

IF the tests in Rule #1 or Rule #2 can not be performed because the respondent did not respond to any or all of Question #s 4,5, 12 and 15,
THEN the respondent is considered to have failed the test. That is, the algorithm assumes that the respondent is a **FIRST-TIME FULL-TIME** freshman unless he/she passes the tests in Rule #1 or Rule #2.
